About **EarthCorps**

EarthCorps is a Seattle-based environmental nonprofit that cultivates leaders and communitv partnerships to advance environmental justice. Driven by a vision of an equitable world where *all* people and nature thrive together, the organization invites young adults from around the country and across the globe to Washington state for a year-long environmental leadership and training program.

Geared toward young adults between the ages of 18 and 25, the AmeriCorps-funded Corps Program teaches corps members skills in leadership and environmental restoration. By caring for the lands, people, and waters of the Puget Sound region, the corps learn innovative and technical skills and practices that protect and restore native ecosystems - leaving EarthCorps with the experience and knowledge to sustain the health of our environment.

Environmental degradation disproportionately impacts low-income communities and communities. In 2022, we pivoted reestablishing our mission and vision to address oppressive systems that remain obstacles to advancing environmental justice. Founding a new team

Our Work: Stories from the Field

Commencement Bay

In the early 1900s, industrialization in Commencement Bay led to polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), dioxin, and heavy metal contamination. The contamination in Commencement Bay and its waterways has negatively impacted native fish and wildlife including birds and salmon.

As part of the multi-year, ecosystem-wide restoration plan, the Commencement Bay trustees (under NOAA's leadership) contracted EarthCorps to restore sites and protect these riparian forests.

Wetlands have the unique ability to break down heavy components through their soil and plants. To promote wetland health and restore the ecosystem, crews manually removed nonnative invasive species - including Himalayan Blackberry and English Ivy.

Mill Creek Canyon

This year, crews continued work on the ongoing Mill Creek Canyon project - moving approximately 6 tons of materials and installing 500 feet of crib wall, out slope legs, and steps.

Partnering with the City of Kent, EarthCorps has identified community needs and created a revitalization plan to design, build, and maintain accessible trails. This project dives deep into city collaborations - with extensive planning and strategizing to ensure long-term sustainability.

In 2022, EarthCorps partnered with King County Wastewater Treatment Division's (KCWD) Mitigation and Monitoring Program on several projects. Spanning 13.82 acres throughout the Puget Sound Region, crews planted 1,639 native trees and shrubs as part of the partnership.

From installing approximately 100 beaver exclusion fences to protect planted conifers and mature cottonwoods to building footbridges for increased accessibility, the partnership with KCWD offered EarthCorps crews field-based learning days where they had the opportunity to develop new skills through diverse projects and discuss topics such as plant identification, ecology, and wetlands.

Spotlight: International Program

Since the beginning of EarthCorps, the International Program has been a key aspect in realizing the vision of building a global community of leaders in restoration. Bringing eager participants from around the world not only gives them valuable training and networking, but it also provides our AmeriCorps members with a greater sense of community and impact. It goes without saying, then, that having to pause the program from 2020 to 2022 due to the pandemic was felt deeply across our organization. This changed when we saw an opportunity in 2022 to bring back the program in a brand new and improved way.

Historically, our International Program ran from June until December with the 14 or so participants joining our AmeriCorps participants as crew members for the rest of the year to learn and work alongside each other. This program was very impactful and valuable for *all* participants and brought plenty of life and energy to the whole organization.

Our ability to run the International Program has been reliant on our partnership with the State

Department and continued certification as a J1 visa training program. This certification allows us to help the participants obtain a visa that lasts for 18 months, which has been a boon for being able to offer a second-year position to participants in the past.

As travel began to reopen around the world, we were able to make the decision to bring back our program on a different timeline than before. Our Program team changed greatly since the hiatus and there needed to be a good deal of teaching and learning to get the program back up and running. In order to sustainably bring the program back, we decided to run it from September to December of 2022. Instead of assigning the participants to existing crews, they would work with different crews and have one day per week in the office to work on their own professional interests. This was designed with the idea of expanding what participants can get from our program as well as what they can teach others here and was largely experimental.

The recruitment process for the International

Program is much more involved than for our AmeriCorps members. After screening and interviewing candidates, we go back-andforth in filling out paperwork, mail necessary documents for their visa appointments, and setting up homestays for them from our wonderful community of host families.

Our 2022 cohort was an amazing group of people who were more than willing to try this experiment with us and provided plenty of great feedback on how to improve the program for the future. Several of them were also originally accepted for the 2020 program that was ultimately cancelled, but were still dedicated enough to reapply. really needed, and we agreed. With help from our entire team, we extended their program to end in April so we could push our experiment further. This second half would be more focused on their professional development as we tasked them with connecting with staff at EarthCorps and other agencies such as King County Wastewater Treatment Division and Birds Connect Seattle to design and complete capstone projects to present to staff.

Ultimately, these projects helped further their existing professional pursuits, inspired new dreams for them to take back home, and helped us in our planning for future programs as we look to improve on this new model for the International Program.
